Giovanni Vecchiato Carola Syz Projects

This photographic series brings together the artist's work from July 2018 to April 2019. The 27 images were taken along the Italian Peninsula over four seasons, which deeply influence the tones of colour and atmosphere.

Giovanni Vecchiato was born in Castelfranco, Veneto, Italy in 1970. He received a degree in Philosophy at Venice University and a MSC at London School of Economics.

Vecchiato's mastery of photography and interest in technical precision began as a child with a gift from his father, an old analogical Zeiss camera. Since then he has been driven by a passion, practice and natural sensibility toward composition and framing.

Vecchiato was always fascinated by the beauty of people, regardless of aesthetic appearance, and the places where people gather.

Growing up he focused on portrait photography and reportage, later combining this with his desire to explore the world and discover different cultures. His photographs stem primarily from places where "humanity palpitates", like Yemen, Israel, Palestine, Cuba, New York, Hong Kong and, of course, Rome! Giovanni's second passion for endurance motorbiking has enabled him to photograph the deserts of Oman, Egypt, Morocco and Algeria. From the highest country in the world, Lesotho and across the black desert of Iceland.


Later moved by a fascination with street photography, Giovanni began to frame people from the sky, and created original pictures where moments of leisure become original spots of colour and games of shadows.

More recently, his exploration of drones in photography led to discovery of a new three-dimensional focal point. The drone has become for Giovanni more than just a "camera in the clouds" but an opportunity to experiment with colour and shadow. And so he began to turn the channels of the Venetian Lagoon into abstract images and the streets of historic Matera into colourful labyrinths. Matter, in his photographs, fuse into just form and colour, which then communicate directly with the mood of the observer.


The beauty in these images is like a dialogue between the infinitely small and the infinitely large which lives in each one of us. In this way photography becomes the instrument with which to explore the essence of everything.


Giovanni currently splits his time between London and Venice with his most inspiring light, his 11 years old daughter Viola.



The "Split" in Venice Lagoon 135 cm x 90 cm 1/3
















